Governor News

As you may have already seen from a letter sent out earlier today, we are delighted to announce that Angel Gurria and Rosa Mottershead have been elected to be our new parent governors. I would like to thank them and all of the other candidates for their commitment to the school, and everyone who voted. This community involvement is such a vital part of the life of St Matthew's.

Below you can find summaries of two of our recent governing body meetings.

Resources Committee, 28th April

The resources committee met on Thursday 28th April primarily to review the finances for the year ended 31 March 2016, to approve the budget for the financial year ending 31 March 2017 and to discuss a recent link governor health and safety visit. Governors were pleased to note that the school ended the last financial year with a surplus (compared with a deficit the prior year) largely thanks to the injection of government funding for Cambridgeshire schools during the period. Kevin, Chair of the Resources Committee and link governor for health and safety, agreed to follow up on a number of items from the health and safety visit including risk assessments and issues raised by the three storey atrium in the main building. The committee proposed that the budget for the new financial year be put to the full governing body for approval.

Full Governing Body, 4th May

The full governing body met on Wednesday 4th May to approve the budget for the financial year ending 31 March 2017 and to discuss the government's proposals for forced academisation of all schools (subsequently partially dropped by the Secretary of State for Education). Governors approved the change of name for the curriculum committee, which will now be known as the Teaching, Learning and Outcomes Committee ("TLOC"). The last governing body meeting of the school year will be held in July.

The above are brief summaries. Full minutes of all governing body and committee meetings are available on the school website once they have been agreed at the next meeting.
