Sending Books Home

Next term we are introducing new assessment systems into the school to replace national curriculum levels. National Curriculum levels have not been statutory since the introduction of the new National Curriculum in September 2014, other than for the statutory tests in Year Two and Year Six this year. We have continued to use them during the course of this year while investigating alternatives. Next year we will be using Target Tracker in school.

We will be giving information to parents about these changes next term. This will be a big focus for our training and development in the Autumn also. To support this work, we will be holding onto more of our literacy and mathematics books from this year than we usually do. We will send them home later in the new school year.
