We came first in five of the eight team events (Year Three Girls, Year Three Boys, Year Four Girls, Year Six Girls, Year Six Boys), came second in the Year 5 Girls race, third in the Year Four Boys race and sixth in the Year 5 Boys race. A large number of parents came along to cheer us on in what was a great event to be a part of.

As well as the team events, there were individual medals for Mark Belukurov-Mora (gold), Lexi Ross (silver), Eve Seyf (Silver), Macy Dexter (bronze).
